**Hidden Path** Elena Fortún 2020-10-30 Set in early twentieth-century Spain, *Hidden Path* is a lyrical coming-of-age novel told from the perspective of a woman painter who struggles to find her way with art and with the women she loved. This edition, with Jeffrey Zamostny's sensitive and nuanced translation, marks the novel's first time appearing in any language aside from Spanish; it is also the first of Fortún's works to appear in English. With an insightful foreword by scholar Nuria Capdevila-Argüelles, this volume will be an influential contribution to women's studies, LGBT histories, and Spanish literature and culture.
